2nd Stop Charity Shop



The shop accepts clean, good quality clothes, books, toys, crockery, ornaments, DVD's, CD's and small items of furniture. They are unable to accept electrical goods, video and audio tapes, cycle helmets, child car seats and pushchairs.

Foxhall Reuse Shop



Working in partnership with Suffolk County Council, FCC Environment and The Benjamin Foundation run a re-use shop based at Foxhall Household Waste Recycling Centre. Proceeds from the shop are used to support [The Benjamin Foundation](#) which is charity that operates in Norfolk and Suffolk supporting people through the challenges that life may bring them, including homelessness, childcare, bullying and abuse.

The shop sell's items suitable for re-use that would otherwise be recycled or disposed of from seven of the 11 HWRCs across Suffolk. This includes furniture, toys, bicycles, books, electrical items and more! All items will be checked and tested in order to be re-sold.
